About College

The purpose of education is man-making and nation building. To make this purpose successfully Bagnan College was established on the auspicious day of 16th July, 1958. The zeal and efforts of Late Badal Chandra Maji, an established business man, a social reformer and a lover of education of Khalore village at Bagnan was instrumental in the setting up of this educational institution. The College is situated at Khalore Gram Panchayat, P.O.- Bagnan, P.S.- Bagnan, Dist.- Howrah, West Bengal. The College is one of the premier institutions of Higher Education in West Bengal boasts of a rich legacy of providing top-notch higher education in the country. The College has been a shining star in the educational landscape in the locality and State of West Bengal.

Since inception the Bagnan College is affiliated to the University of Calcutta and recognized by the University Grants Commission (UGC) under Section 2(f) and 12B of the University Grants Commission Act, 1956. Despite several limitations and obstacles, the College has continued to grow and currently teaches about 5400 undergraduate students coming from divergent socio-economic backgrounds with poor economic conditions. Since inception, in every academic session a large number of students enroll in the College for pursuing their undergraduate studies coming from divergent socio-economic backgrounds with different castes and creeds of which a large number of students belongs to minority, SC, ST and OBC & EWS categories. More importantly, a large number of students are girl students (nearly of 65%) and a majority of the students found to be the first generation learners with BPL category.

The College offers 14 Under Graduate programmes in three different shifts, namely, Day (Arts/ Humanities & Science – Co-Ed.), Evening (Commerce-Co-Ed.) and Morning (Arts/ Humanities-Girls) and catering about 5000 regular students. Since long the College has been running a Distance Learning Study Centre under Netaji Subhash Open University (NSOU) and catering about 3000 students for UG & PG courses. The College runs three shifts - Morning, Day and Evening under the same management and control with one Governing Body. The Bagnan College is Government -Aided and governed by the provisions of the Calcutta University; the West Bengal Universities and Colleges (Administration and Regulation) Act, 2017; orders/notifications of the Directorate of Public Instruction of Govt. of West Bengal and the University Grants Commission Act, 1956.

ADUITS

Modern auditing has manifold and far-reaching social, economic, cultural, legal, ethical and environmental implications. The socio-economic-legal obligations of modern auditing and audit profession have mounted in recent years with the rapid growth of limited liability companies, corporations, partnerships, sole proprietorships and non-profit seeking organizations like school, colleges, universities, clubs etc. those involved in financial activities.

In recent times new audit concepts have evolved. There is an emphasis on 'effectiveness evaluation', 'system evaluation', 'performance appraisal', 'risk assessment' etc. As a result, 'cost audit', 'management audit', 'personnel audit', 'performance audit', 'propriety audit', 'tax audit', 'internal audit', 'information system audit', 'quality audit', 'forensic audit', 'administrative audit', 'social audit', 'environment audit', 'green audit', 'energy audit', 'gender audit' etc. came in vogue.

As audit has several connotations, implications and facets, it is very difficult to define audit precisely.

According to A. A. Arens, R. J. Elder, and M. S. Beasley, "Auditing is the accumulation and evaluation of evidence about information to determine and report on the degree of correspondence between the information and established criteria. Auditing should be done by a competent, independent person."

The Institute of Chartered Accountants of India (ICAI) defines auditing as: "A systematic and independent examination of data, statements, records, operations, and performances (financial or otherwise) of an

enterprise for a stated purpose. In any auditing situation, the auditor perceives and recognizes the propositions before him for examination, collects evidence, evaluates the same and on this basis formulates his judgement which is communicated through his audit report.”

Best Practice-1

Objective –For smooth operation of Kanyashree Prakalpa Yojana (Scheme), launched by Government of West Bengal

Context –It is a conditional cash transfer plan aiming to improve the status of the school and College going girl child in the state of West Bengal.

Practice –Online ID transfer from previous institution to present institution for eligible girl students are initiated through Kanyashree portal.

Evidence of Success –Has achieved first position among undergraduate Colleges in Howrah district in the session 2022-23.

Problems encountered –The bureaucratic system and over-enthusiastic guardians created problems and/or delayed the process of Kanyashree.

Resources Required –State Government fund was spent in successful execution of the Kanyashree scheme.

Best Practice-2

Title of the Practice – A Drive Towards Energy Conservation

Objective –To conserve the conventional energy resources and to decrease the high electricity consumption of the College.

Context –To cut off the dependence on fossil fuels.

Practice –Solar panels were installed and WBSEDCL connected the installation to the power grid with the help of the supplier.

Evidence of Success –Thus total saving in College purse is nearly ₹1, 30,534/- per annum. In addition, carbon-di-oxide emission is reduced by nearly 19000kg per annum.

Problems encountered –The work also needed financial resources of the College.

Resources required –Thus, the financial assistance from the Government or any other funding agency/ source is needed.

Institutional Distinctiveness

The distinctiveness of the College is embedded in its principles of diffusing noble inspiration and culture amongst the neighboring villagers, specifically to cater for educational interests of the public at large and to promote and encourage advancement of Arts, Science and Commerce education and to empower women and weaker sections by providing quality education through equal opportunities.

STRENGTH, WEAKNESS, OPPORTUNITY AND CHALLENGES (SWOC)

A. Institutional Strength

- **History and Heritage:** The College has a long and enriched history in providing quality education. Since inception, the College has been a shining star in the educational landscape in the locality and the State of West Bengal. Since inception the College is affiliated to the University of Calcutta and recognized by the University Grants Commission (UGC) under Section 2(f) and 12B of the University Grants Commission Act, 1956. The College is dedicated to achieving the vision and mission and objectives for which the College was established.
- **Locational Advantage:** The College is conveniently located near to Bagnan Railway Station of the South Eastern Railway (SER) and seamlessly connected to National Highway No. 6 (NH-6) is easily accessible, making it a preferred choice for discerning students seeking quality education. The geographical location is advantageous.
- **Governance and Management:** The Governing Body is the highest policy and decision making body. The Governing Body appoints several subcommittees viz., IQAC, Academic Sub-Committee, Finance Sub-Committee and other Sub-Committees for proper and efficient management of the College. The Governing Body is vigilant, judicious and perceptive, ensuring the mitigation of problems and favorable resolutions in the interests of the College. The transparency in financial transactions is always maintained.
- **Infrastructural Facilities & Environment:** The College provides adequate and modern infrastructural facilities, good academic ambience and pollution free green and clean physical environment. The conducive academic environment, infrastructural facilities and green and clean campus of the College attracts the students for enrolment.

- **Qualified Teaching Faculties:** Qualified teaching faculties with different specialized subjects/fields are appointed by following the UGC Regulations, Calcutta University Regulations and State Government Rules. All fulltime teaching faculties and Librarians are appointed as per the recommendation of the West Bengal College Service Commission (WBCSC).
- **Academic Programmes:** The College offers undergraduate B.A. & B.Sc. (Hons. & Gen./Multidisciplinary: Day Shift - Co-Ed.) and B.Com. (Hons. & Gen./Multidisciplinary: Evening Shift- Co-Ed.) and B.A. (Gen./Multidisciplinary: Morning Shift - Girls) regular 14 programmes under CBCS and CCF curriculum of the University of Calcutta.
- **Online Admission & Reservation Rules:** The College since long follows Online Students Admission process strictly based on the merits and follows the reservation rules of the Government for SC, ST, OBC, PH/PC students etc.
- **Knowledge Resource Centre:** The College has a rich and well equipped Knowledge Resource Centre / Library with an archival section and research corner, digital cataloguing OPAC facilities, subscription to different academic and research based journal and e-resources (NLIST) and Koha ILMS with D-Space for digital institutional repository. The well stocked library with separate Reading Room facility for students and faculty is another strength.
- **Students Induction, Mentoring & Seminar:** The College has good relationship between the students and teachers with regular students mentoring including students seminars for academic and personality development of the students. It also arranges students' induction programmes at the time of admission and also organises annual exposure visits of neighbouring school students for awareness , career guidance and better enrolment in the College.
- **Continuous Professional Growth & Capacity Building:** The College provides adequate facilities for academic and professional growth of teaching faculties and organizes seminars, workshops, conferences etc. for academic development and capacity building of the faculties.
- **Capacity Building and Skill Enhancement of Students:** The College is dedicated to serving the students irrespective of cast, creeds, religion, gender, income, social status etc.. The College encourages students and provides facilities for the holistic development of the students. It also provides facilities for personality development, capacity building and skill enhancement including entrepreneurship and employment opportunities.
- **Continuous Students Support and Grievance Re-dressal Mechanism:** The College continuously helps and supports the students from different angles and resolves their grievances including the support to ex-students for academic verification and academic transcript for the purpose of higher studies and employment after pass out.
- **Add-On, Certificate and Diploma Courses:** The College provides certain Add-on and short-term certificate and diploma courses including modern computer course beyond the undergraduate programmes offered to the students for skill development, entrepreneurship and opening up for employment opportunities for them.
- **MOU & Linkages/Collaborative Activities:** The College signed MOUs for collaborative activities with different Colleges/organizations for academic, skill and personality development and practical knowledge up gradation including promotion of critical thinking and innovative approach of learning.
- **Students' Performance & Awards:** The academic performances of the students in terms of pass-out percentage, progression to higher studies and placement / employment in services are appreciable. These apart, the students of the College receive awards, recognitions and chances in different curricular and extra-curricular activities.
- **Diversity and Inclusiveness:** A large number of students come from divergent socio-economic backgrounds with different castes and creeds and belongs to general category, minority, SC, ST and OBC & EWS categories. More importantly, a large number of students are girl students (nearly of 65%) and a majority of them found to be the first generation learners with very poor economic backgrounds. This helps to identify the diverse ideas of thinking inclusively and promote better academic, personal and professional growth among the students.
- **Democratic Management:** The College always believes in participatory and democratic management including women empower and gender equity.
- **Green Campus and Pollution Free Campus:** Towards green and pollution free campus initiatives were taken for (a) plantation of trees and maintaining Medicinal Gardens, (b) vehicle free campus, (c) restricted use of plastics, (d) regular campus cleaning, (d) regular waste management, (e) Green and Energy Audits facilities, organizing awareness programmes etc.

- **Institutional Social Responsibility:** The College with the help of three NSS Units organize different extension and outreach programmes including students exposure visits with the help of neighbouring schools.
- **Feedback Mechanism:** The College regularly takes formal Feedbacks from its different stakeholders, analysed them and takes necessary action for further improvement/development.
- **Registered Alumni Association:** The College has a Registered Alumni Association established for the development of the College. Since long many among our ex-students/ alumni have become teachers in school and colleges, administrative officers in the University, politicians, professionals in journalism and mass communication, serving banking, insurance, retail, pharmaceutical & IT firms– both in the private and public sectors.
- **NSS Units and Activities:** The College has three NSS Units for three shifts of the College. The NSS Units take regular initiatives for social, outreach and awareness programmes.
- **Cordial Relationships:** The cordial relationships among students, teaching faculties and non-teaching staff with alumni and parents/guardians.
- **Shouldering Social Responsibility:** In keeping with the Vision and Mission statements the College shoulders the social responsibility of imparting education to economically underprivileged and deprived, first-generation learners and minority students making them employable graduates, with a Morning Section reserved exclusively for girl students.
- **Commitments of Teachers' and Support Staff:** Majority off aculty members are academically oriented committed teachers, pursuing research works far as possible, given their loaded teaching assignments and limited infrastructural support. The teaching faculties and support staff are committed too.
- **Remedial Coaching and Coaching for Entry in Service:** The College provides for remedial coaching for the benefit of slow learners and less privileged students and coaching for entry to service for employability.
- **Institutional Facilities:** The College provides several facilities viz., ICT-based class rooms, Internship facilities, Research and Development facilities, Library OPAC, e-resources (NLIST) and Koha ILMS with D-Space facilities, incubation centre, purified drinking water, sickroom facility, vending machine for girls students, common room facility, adequate toilet and washrooms, students' cheap stores, canteen facilities, laboratory, generator facility, high speed free internet facility, decorated class rooms, barrier-free facility for physically-challenged people with wheel-chairs, ramps and toilet & washrooms facility, computer laboratories, E-Learning Management System, play ground, indoor and outdoor games and sports facilities, Gymnasium, Yoga, Karate facilities, Seminar halls with AC facilities, Health checkup facility, Career counseling and placement, financial assistance for meritorious students, government and private scholarships, fees concession for poor and backward students, College and wall magazine facility, training / coaching for competitive examinations, staff training, Electoral Literacy Club, Kanyashree Club, cultural and awareness programmes, regular excursion, tour, filed visit, industry visit facilities, departmental alumni meet / re-union, alumni association, employees' Cooperative Credit Society facility, Security and CCTV surveillance, Anti-ragging cell, Grievance re-dressal cell, ST/SC/OBC Cell, Solar power plants, use of LCD lights, master switches, Mushroom Cultivation Unit, Medicinal Garden etc.

B. Institutional Weaknesses

- **Want of Teaching Staff and Non-teaching Staff:** The College faces severe shortage of permanent support/non-teaching staff and teaching staff as compared to the number of departments and students strength. The dearth of support staff in various sections like library, office, laboratories, Principal room with adequate technical skills and expertise hinders day to operations.
- **Substantial Expenditure for Support Staff:** The substantial expenditures for Casual / temporary support staff from the College fund is another limitations. Their remuneration is not adequate / fair also.
- **Financial Constraints:** The College mainly depends on fees collection from students. The Government and UGC grants are not available adequately and timely. Due to the paucity of funds the College could not implement several projects like auditorium, hostels, elevator, barrier free more physical facilities and introducing new courses including extension activities and outreach programmes.
- **Energy Conservation and Pollution Free Campus:** The College conducted green and energy audits

and carbon footprints in the College were estimated. The College has installed solar power plants, LCD light/tubes, master switch and restricted motor vehicles in the campus etc. Despite it, it needs more effective energy conservation policy etc. for healthy academic environment and making the College carbon negative, pollution and plastic free.

- **Limitation for Course Curriculum:** The College being affiliated to the University of Calcutta follows the curriculum framework of the university. As a result, the College and its Departments has no flexibility in respect of course-curriculum.
- **Students-Teacher Ratio:** the students-teacher ratio of the College is not optimum rather poor that needs to be improved for better academic results.
- **Hostels and Staff Quarter:** The College has no hostels for Boys and Girls and Staff quarter. Due to the paucity of funds and space these were not materialize.
- **ICT-enabled/ Smart Class Rooms & Auditorium:** The College needs more ICT-enabled/ Smart Class Rooms. The College has no auditorium for programmes. Due to the paucity of funds this was not materialize.
- **Introduction of New Courses:** The College needs to be introduced more UG Courses and few PG Courses. Further, more Add-on Courses with the scope of employment opportunities need to be introduced to boost up employability of the students.
- **Space Constraints:** Space constraints inhibiting development and growth including opening of new UG and PG courses / Add-On /Certificate courses, expansion of class rooms and more laboratories is another weakness.
- **Irregular Attendance of Students:** Many economically backward students are compelled to take part-time jobs to supplement the family income. They also come from far distance. Thus, they become irregular and back regular classes.
- **Admission of Average Students:** The College as situated in rural area with poor economic background compels and/or stresses on admission of large number of average merit students for pursuing general under graduate courses at the cost of quality. The meritorious students take admission in some honours courses only.

C. Institutional Opportunities

- The College has ample opportunities to develop more linkages with Government and University for introducing more UG & PG Courses.
- The College has the scope to develop linkage to industrial houses, NGOs and other institutions for students internships, fostering awareness and outreach programmes, introducing more short-term Add-on & skill-oriented Certificate courses as well as UGC runs MOOCs and SWAYAM courses and providing employment opportunities to the students.
- The College has possibility of generation and utilization of more solar energy in the campus through financial support from the Government / other authority.
- The College has potential research and publication works by the faculty members and to get more research projects from the Government/ UGC and other agencies.
- There is possibility continuous professional growth and creating of e-content by teaching faculties through up-gradation of the available e-learning aids with the help of College, UGC and other websites.
- The National Education Policy of 2020 has opened up an opportunity for the College in general to execute inter-disciplinary and multi-disciplinary based research works and academic activities.
- Offering vocational courses/ skill development add-on/certificate courses / programmes in accordance with the profile of our students and local employability.
- Create an ambience and provide more facilities for enhancing research and project work to be conducted by faculty members and students.
- Building partnerships and dialogue with private, non-private and public sectors so that students gain exposure to employment practices and opportunities.
- Organising more ICT-based computer training programmes both for teaching and for non-teaching staff. Furthermore, open training opportunities for competitive examinations and a Language lab to enhance proficiency in English and job etiquette.
- To review sub-committees poor in performance and motivate them, emphasizing the importance of their contribution to the over-all development and growth of the institution.

- Introducing regular professional counseling for students.

D. Institutional Challenges

- To take challenge as a large number of students coming from divergent socio-economic backgrounds with different castes and creeds of which a large number students belongs to minority, SC, ST and OBC & EWS categories of which nearly 65% is girls students.
- To take challenge as the majority of the students found to be the first generation learners coming from very poor economic backgrounds.
- To organize regular career counseling and recruitment programmes for offering more placement and job opportunities to the pass-out students.
- To organize more workshops, state, national and international level seminars / conferences and research works for continuous profession growth and development.
- To procure / recruit more permanent teaching faculties for further improvement of the teacher-student ratio for the smooth conduct of the academic activities.
- To adapt rapidly changing world with cutting-edge technology.
- To take challenge for poor quality of students. The large number of first generation earners in Higher Education with linguistic / semantic barriers act as an impediment to communication and effective teaching-learning. It is indeed a challenge to give them a holistic education and make them employable graduates.
- To take challenge for transformation from traditional mind set among staff, faculty and students towards a rapidly change ICT based and digital quality environment.
- To retain good quality and meritorious students. Also to take challenge for dropout students in different science subjects including the general courses.

Section -XXXVIII

Execution of Proposed Plan for 2022-2023

2. IQAC aims at a sustainable and holistic approach to the development of the institution in a coordinated way. A major step in curricular planning is the introduction of NEP as an interdisciplinary and multi-disciplinary approach.
3. More thrust would be given on the Value Added Courses to empower the students for self-employment which is one of the important aspects of NEP.
4. Seminars and Workshops on different topics/issues like women empowerment, gender issues etc. would be done to encourage both the teachers and students.
5. Extension activities would be continued in the neighborhood areas on different issues with the cooperation of the students and teachers along with the NSS Units of the college.
6. Conservation of energy and environment would also be on the focus of IQAC. A concrete planning for the installation of solar panel must be done in the next academic year so that optimum utilization of solar energy would be possible which will decrease the electric bill amount of the institute.
7. Initiatives would be taken to form the Alumni association.
8. Timely submission of Annual Quality Assurance Report (AQAR) and participation in NIRF will be the prime objective of the IQAC in the next session.

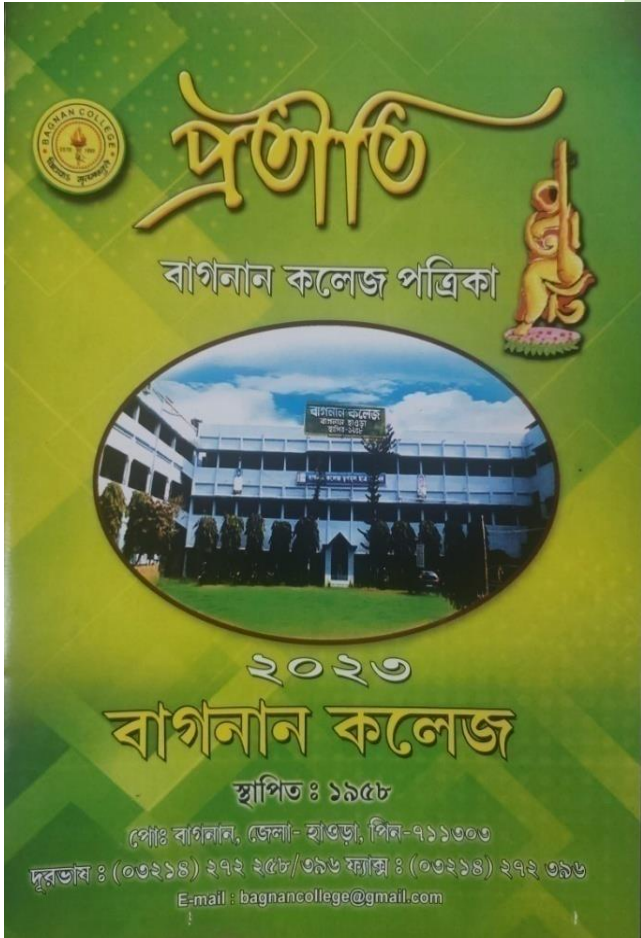
